About TT Supermolot Neue

TT Supermolot Neue 2.0 is a redesigned, extended and greatly enhanced reincarnation of the popular TT Supermolot and TT Supermolot Condensed font families. During its existence, the hammers ('molot' in Russian) managed to get into the spotlight in a huge number of projects, for example, in popular video games, films, and branding. And while the old families could offer designers only a limited number of tools, in the new version you can already find 73 fonts, and each individual font now consists of more than 749 glyphs.

First, we have added a completely new subfamily, TT Supermolot Neue Expanded (now + TT Supermolot Neue Extended). But this is only the tip of the iceberg—in order to achieve visual harmony between the subfamilies, we

completely revised the distribution of widths among them. As a result of this work, the width of the TT Supermolot Neue Basic subfamily became a bit narrower, and the width of the TT Supermolot Neue Condensed subfamily became even narrower than it was in the old version. Secondly, we've increased the number of weights. While in the old versions there were only 5 weights, in the new ones there are 9 in each of the subfamilies.

In addition, we gave a facelift to the lowercase and uppercase letters. In TT Supermolot Neue, the design of all controversial grapheme forms was soothed and now the family can also be used in the text set. We have completely redrawn italics. It took us half a year to compensate for all the circles, to transform italic

strokes, to work out the position of the diacritics, to make right the spacing, and to finish kerning.

Following a good tradition, in the TT Supermolot Neue extensive support for useful OpenType features was added, and hinting was also improved. If we talk about visual features, we recommend paying closer attention to two stylistic sets: the first set (ss01) is designed to make the typeface more humanist, and when you turn on the second set (ss02), the typeface becomes even more technological. In addition, the typeface has more than 26 items of standard and discretionary ligatures. We also have not forgotten about the figures and we added a set of old-style figures to the standard version.

Superman #1 appeared in the summer of 1939. Superman had the distinction of being the first ever hero-character featured in more than one comic magazine.

TT Supermolot Neue Thin 16 pt

Due to the Superman character's popularity, National Allied Publications decided to launch an entirely new magazine featuring a single character, that was unprecedented.

TT Supermolot Neue ExtraLight 16 pt

Superman #23 featured the first Superman story written by someone other than Jerry Siegel. The story "America's Secret Weapon!" was written by Don Cameron.

TT Supermolot Neue Light 16 pt

The strip proved so popular that National launched Superman into his own self-titled comic book, the first for any superhero, premiering with the cover date Summer 1939.

TT Supermolot Neue Thin Italic 16 pt

Editor Mort Weisinger began his association with the title with issue #11. Jimmy Olsen first appeared as a named character in the story "Superman versus The Archer".

TT Supermolot Neue ExtraLight Italic 16 pt

In the early 1940s, Superman was selling over a million copies per month. By 1942, one of Shuster's assistants, Wayne Boring, had become a major artist on Superman.

TT Supermolot Neue Light Italic 16 pt

Examples

Superman (a fantastic comic book hero) is an ongoing American comic book series featuring the DC Comics superhero Superman as its main protagonist.

TT Supermolot Neue Regular 16 pt

Artist Curt Swan became the definitive artist of Superman in the early 1960s with a "new look" to the character that replaced Wayne Boring's version.

TT Supermolot Neue Medium 16 pt

Superman began as one of several anthology features in the National Periodical Publications comic book Action Comics #1 in June 1938.

TT Supermolot Neue DemiBold 16 pt

Siegel introduced Mister Mxyzptlk in issue #30. A more detailed origin story for Superman was presented in issue #53 to mark the character's tenth anniversary.

TT Supermolot Neue Italic 16 pt

Perry White, a supporting character who had originated on the Superman radio program was introduced into the comic book in issue #7 (October 1940).

TT Supermolot Neue Medium Italic 16 pt

Another part of the Superman mythos made its way into the comic books when kryptonite was featured in a story by Bill Finger and Al Plastino.

Examples

Due to the Superman character's popularity, National Allied Publications decided to launch an entirely new magazine featuring a single character.

TT Supermolot Neue Bold 16 pt

Superman was relaunched with a new #1 issue in a second volume in 1986, and was published concurrently with The Adventures of Superman.

TT Supermolot Neue ExtraBold 16 pt

Between 1986 and 2006 comic book Superman was retitled, The Adventures of Superman, while a new series used the title Superman.

TT Supermolot Neue Black 16 pt

In May 2006, it was returned to its original title and numbering. The title was canceled with issue #714 in 2011, and was re-launched the following month.

TT Supermolot Neue Bold Italic 16 pt

Superman now also had the distinction of being the first ever hero-character featured in more than one comic magazine, in the summer of 1939.

TT Supermolot Neue ExtraBold Italic 16 pt

A fourth series of Superman was released in June 2016 and ended in April 2018, while the fifth series was launched in July 2018.

TT Supermolot Neue Black Italic 16 pt

Examples

Julius Schwartz with issue #233 (January 1971) and together with writer Denny O'Neil and artist Curt Swan streamlined the Superman mythos, starting with the elimination of Kryptonite.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Thin 16 pt

Superman #300 (June 1976) featured an out-of-continuity story by Bates and Maggin which imagined the infant Superman landing on Earth in 1976 and becoming a superhero in 2001.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed ExtraLight 16 pt

The tale was an inspiration for Mark Millar's Superman: Red Son limited series published in 2003. DC's parent company Warner Communications reinstated the byline for Jerry Siegel.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Light 16 pt

Superman was the first DC title with a letters column as a regular feature. Issues #272 (Feb. 1974), #278 (Aug. 1974), and #284 (Feb. 1975) of the series were in the 100 Page Super Spectacular format.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Thin Italic 16 pt

Writer Cary Bates, in collaboration with Swan, introduced such characters as the supervillain Terra-Man in issue #249 (March 1972) and the superhero Vartox in issue #281 (Nov. 1974).

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed ExtraLight Italic 16 pt

Writer Jim Shooter and Swan crafted the story "Superman's Race With the Flash!" in Superman #199 (Aug. 1967) which featured the first race between the Flash and Superman.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Light Italic 16 pt

Examples

Martin Pasko and Swan created the Master Jailer character in issue #331 (January 1979). The bottle city of Kandor, which had been introduced in 1958, was restored to normal size.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Regular 16 pt

The series reached issue #400 in October 1984. That issue featured work by several popular comics artists including the only major DC work by Jim Steranko.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Medium 16 pt

Folding their vast multiverse into a single shared universe, Superman and his supporting cast would receive a massive overhaul at the hands of writer/artist John Byrne.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed DemiBold 16 pt

One last story, which also marked the end of Schwartz's tenure as editor of the series, was published: Alan Moore's Whatever Happened to the Man of Tomorrow?

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Italic 16 pt

The story's first part saw publication in Superman #423, which would be the last issue before the title was relaunched with its legacy numbering as The Adventures of Superman.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Medium Italic 16 pt

The Adventures of Superman was numbered from issue #424 (January 1987) to issue #649 (April 2006), for a total of 228 monthly issues including issue #0 (October 1994).

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed DemiBold Italic 16 pt

Examples

Folding their vast multiverse into a single shared universe, Superman and his supporting cast would receive a massive overhaul at the hands of writer/artist John Byrne.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Bold 16 pt

Issue #0 (October 1994) as a tie-in to the Zero Hour limited series and issue #1,000,000 (November 1998) as a tie-in to the DC One Million limited series.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed ExtraBold 16 pt

To coordinate the storyline and sequence of event, from January 1991 to January 2002, "triangle numbers" appeared on the cover of each Superman comic book.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Black 16 pt

When the series was relaunched in late 1986 under its new title (The Adventures of Superman), the creative team initially was writer Marv Wolfman and artist Jerry Ordway.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Bold Italic 16 pt

Writer/artist Dan Jurgens worked on the title from 1989–1991. Hank Henshaw, a character who would later become the Cyborg Superman, first appeared in issue #466).

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed ExtraBold Italic 16 pt

Superman ran uninterrupted until the mid-1980s, when DC Comics instituted a line-wide relaunch with the 1985 event maxi-series Crisis on Infinite Earths.

TT Supermolot Neue Condensed Black Italic 16 pt

Examples

Tom Grummett drew part of #480 and became the main artist. The series participated in the crossover storyline "Panic in the Sky" in 1992.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Thin 16 pt

The stories by Greg Rucka included the villain Ruin, the attempted assassination of Lois Lane and a number of Mister Mxyzptlk appearances.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded ExtraLight 16 pt

Grummett and Ordway were the architects of "The Death of Superman" storyline, in which Superman died and was resurrected.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Light 16 pt

It was during that storyline, that Grummett and writer Karl Kesel, created the new Superboy in The Adventures of Superman #500 (June 1993).

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Thin Italic 16 pt

The integration between the Superman titles became less frequent, and the issues of The Adventures of Superman carried self-contained stories.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded ExtraLight Italic 16 pt

Adventures of Superman was relaunched. The first story was to have been written by Orson Scott Card and drawn by Chris Sprouse and Karl Story.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Light Italic 16 pt

Examples

Card's Superman story was dropped. The relaunched Adventures of Superman series came to an end with issue #17, released in 2014.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Regular 16 pt

Significantly, Superman volume 2 reached issue #226 (April 2006) and was then canceled as part of the linewide Infinite Crisis event.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Medium 16 pt

Superman had a crossover with Action Comics, titled "Up, Up and Away!" co-written by Geoff Johns and Kurt Busiek.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded DemiBold 16 pt

Unlike the previous volume, the new series is not set in the mainstream DC Universe continuity but instead features anthology style stories.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Italic 16 pt

The Adventures of Superman was returned to its original title, Superman, with issue #650, as a part of the "One Year Later" banner.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Medium Italic 16 pt

This storyline told of Clark Kent attempting to protect Metropolis without his powers until eventually regaining them.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded DemiBold Italic 16 pt

Examples

The final issue (#649) was part of an homage to the Earth-2 Superman in the wake of events in the limited series Infinite Crisis.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Bold 16 pt

Illustrator Chris Sprouse left the project due to the media attention and some comic book stores announced a boycott.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded ExtraBold 16 pt

The Superman storylines Superman, Action Comics, Superman: The Man of Steel and Superman: The Man of Tomorrow.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Black 16 pt

In May 2006, it was returned the title was canceled with issue #714 in 2011, and was relaunched the following month.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Bold Italic 16 pt

It is released as a digital-first comic with print publication to follow. Card's participation in the project became an issue.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded ExtraBold Italic 16 pt

Other crossovers the series participated in included Zero Hour: Crisis in Time, The Final Night, and Infinite Crisis.

TT Supermolot Neue Expanded Black Italic 16 pt

Examples

Busiek became the sole writer of the series with issue #654 (September 2006) and the series' artist Carlos Pacheco.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended Thin 16 pt

The series participated in the weekly series Countdown to Final Crisis, giving a different perspective on certain events.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended ExtraLight 16 pt

A new monthly series Superman: Son of Kal-El, written by Tom Taylor and art by John Timms, replaced the title.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended Light 16 pt

James Robinson replaced Busiek with issue #677. Robinson's run on the title began with "The Coming of Atlas" story arc.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended Thin Italic 16 pt

The plotline concluded in Superman Annual #13. Alex Ross painted the covers for issues #675 through #685.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended ExtraLight Italic 16 pt

A link between Superman, Action Comics, and Supergirl started a long-form narrative with the New Krypton event.

Examples

The series follows the adventures of Jon Kent, the son of Superman, as he is entrusted with the protection of Earth.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended Regular 16 pt

Peter J. Tomasi and Patrick Gleason are the creative team, with the Superman series shipping twice-monthly.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended Medium 16 pt

Busiek and Pacheco developed an extended storyline featuring Arion coming into conflict with Superman.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended DemiBold 16 pt

A fifth series under the direction of Brian Michael Bendis began on July 11, 2018. The series ended with issue #32.

This volume's 34th issue was also the 800th issue of the Superman series as a whole, with cover by Tony S. Daniel.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended Medium Italic 16 pt

DC Comics launched Superman volume 3 with issue #1 in September 2011, as part of The New 52.

Examples

As part of the DC Re-birth relaunch, Superman Volume 4 began with issue #1 in June 2016 (August 2016).

TT Supermolot Neue Extended Bold 16 pt

Issue #600 (March 2002) was a double-sized special featuring Superman combating Lex Luthor.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended ExtraBold 16 pt

Unlike the previous volume, the new series is not set in the mainstream DC Universe continuity.

Dan Jurgens began to co-write and draw Superman with Keith Giffen. Their first issue was #7 (2012).

Scott Lobdell and Kenneth Rocafort became the creative team, as of September 2012's issue #0.

TT Supermolot Neue Extended ExtraBold Italic 16 pt

The final issue #649 was part of a three-part crossover with Superman and Action Comics.

The Hummer H1 is a four-wheel-drive utility vehicle based on the M998 Humvee, which was created by AM General. The vehicle was produced from 1992 through 2006, and was the first of what became the Hummer line. Originally designed strictly for military use, the off-road vehicle was released to the civilian market due to market demand. It was initially known as the "Hummer". Hummer H1s have other unusual features, such as inboard brakes and portal gears that allow the drivetrain's half shafts a higher placement, for greater ground clearance. Options included leather seats.
